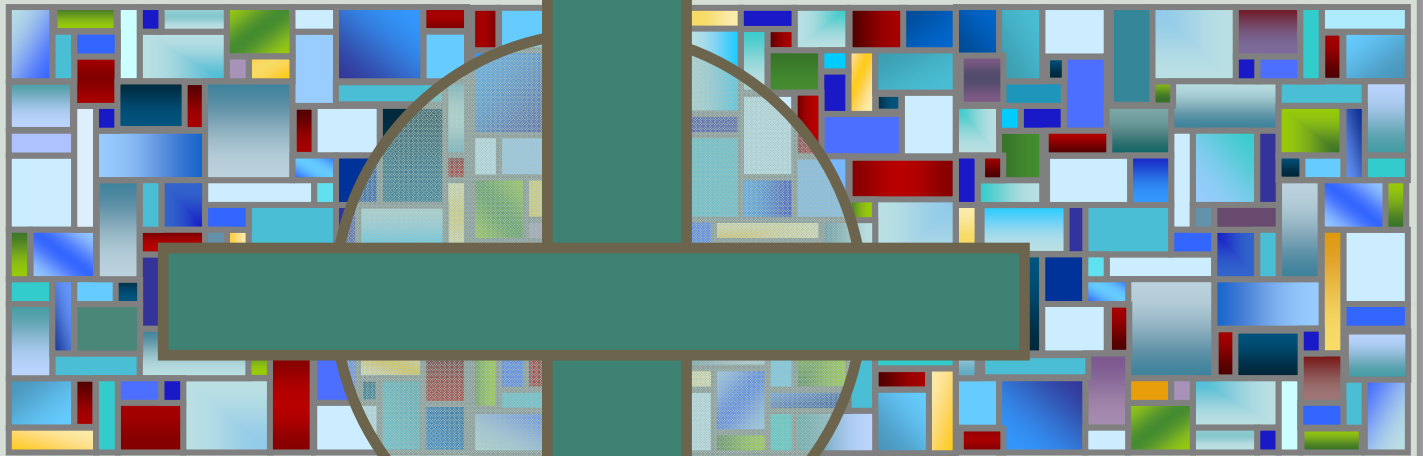

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's second reading is from the Letter to the Hebrews where the author reminds us of the raw power of the Word of God. "The Word of God is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating bone and marrow; able to discern the very thoughts of the heart."

That power teaches, governs and make us holy in the sight of God, if only we listen attentively and allow the Word to take root in our hearts. Bear this enjoiner in mind whenever you come to celebrate the Eucharist. Receive the Word in openness and in obedience yield your heart to its teaching.

COMING UP IN THE NEXT FEW WEEKS

Now that we are past the Providence Fest 2018, and I will share with you a report once all the data is in.

We look forward to A Stewardship Campaign named **Providential Care and Enduring Love**. These words are taken from our newly adopted Parish Mission Statement. Next week I will be speaking at all of the Masses Saturday and Sunday to address the importance of Stewardship to the vitality and viability of our parish. You will be receiving information and instructions about the program. If you have not received a copy of the 2018 Stewardship Report I distributed at the Masses September 29 & 30, please obtain one and read it carefully. Copies are available in the church vestibule.

November 2 is All Souls' Day. As it has been our custom these last two years we will be celebrating our annual Mass of Remembrance that evening at 7 pm. At that time we will pray for all the deceased of our parish, including and especially those who we buried in the past year. If you would like to have a loved one remembered please contact the parish office by Friday October 26.

SIX NEW SAINTS ARE CANONIZED

Today in Rome Pope Francis will canonized six new saints. Four of them have only local European appeal: St. Francisco Spinelli, St. Vincenzo Romano, St. Mary Katherine Kasper, and St. Nazaria Ignacia. Two of these new saints have global name recognition: St. Paul VI and St. Oscar Romero. Let me speak about these last two new saints.

Saint Paul VI, born Giovanni Montini, was ordained in Rome in 1920 and began a career in the Vatican Diplomatic Corp and the Roman Curia. Having demonstrated great skill, he was appointed Archbishop of Milan by St. John XXIII and named a Cardinal. When Pope John died in 1963, Montini was elected his successor, taking the name Pope Paul VI. It fell to him to complete the work of Vatican II interrupted by the death of Pope John and oversee its implementation which was theological, liturgical and pastoral.

Paul VI possessed great wisdom and calmness in proceeding through the challenging post-conciliar period. After leading the Church for 15 years he died in 1978, the year of the three popes.

Saint Oscar Romero was born in El Salvador in Central America in 1917. His priestly ministry was very pastoral in its orientation as El Salvador was challenged by great political and social unrest. In 1977 Pope Paul VI appointed him Archbishop of San Salvador, the national capitol. Immediately he was embroiled in the struggle between socialism, theology, preference for the poor, and civil rights as well as the freedom of the Church to exercise its ministry without interference. Among many threats from the socialist government, he was assassinated by the military on behalf of the social government on March 24, 1980 while celebrating Mass in a small parish church in one of the most dangerous neighborhoods of the country. He was declared a martyr for the faith and champion for social justice.

Saint Paul VI, pray for us! St. Oscar Romero, pray for us!

Next week we are going to meet with the villagers in Guanacaste to plan the specifics of the building that will house the water system. The project also includes a "teach the teacher" piece that addresses when and how to use the clean water and the importance to good handwashing.
